Worship Notes

It is finished.

Words that Jesus spoke as he died on the cross. What must it have been like for the disciples to be with Jesus, prior to this moment, as He spoke to them over and again about His death, burial, and resurrection. How this must have all seemed so odd to them as it was happening. To finally have the Messiah, the Savior, here on earth, to only see Him taken in the middle of the night, beaten and mocked, scourged, spat upon, and eventually nailed to a cross to die alongside common criminals. And then He says these words of finality that He has accomplished the goal that He set out to meet. His Words on the cross are so direct and exactly what the Savior would say, what He must say. And then showing us His character even more deeply, He says, "Father forgive them, for they know not what they do." Even in death, Jesus was graceful and merciful. Even as the high priest and elders slapped Him in the face, Jesus' love never relented for us and even for them as they murdered Him.

What did Jesus mean, when He said it is finished? Was He simply relinquishing His hold on human life, or was something far greater happening? We must always keep in perspective that Jesus was fully God, yet still fully human. He had to relinguish His mortal life in order for man's sin debt to be paid. He was the sacrifice. He also had to go to the grave, just as He had told the disciples, so that He could rise again on the third day. But why? To simply be a man of His Word? "It is finished" encompasses so many promises. The wrath of God towards man's sin was satisfied once and for all. With this statement, Jesus took on death and hell, for our sakes, so that we could be reconciled to the Father. He also establishes that His ministry on earth as it was, had ended, and that He must now, as He said earlier, go away so that one greater than He could dwell within us.

When sin drags you back into feelings of guilt and shame, anxiety and worry, pride and hatred, and you cannot see clearly, know that on a cross many years ago, a man, a carpenter, a teacher, a Savior, the Son of God said the words "It is finished", and He meant them not only in that moment, but in every moment for the rest of eternity. He has already overcome sin. He has already overcome death. He experienced everything that we struggle with, and his reply was to take on the weight of our sin, the penalty for our sin, the price for our sin, and be the lamb without spot and without blemish. He paid the price for you and for me and it is finished.
